Club president Clark Hymas, along with several volunteers and club members, worked with local organizations and a group of RC-related businesses to make the event a success. Many of the companies, including Valley View RC, provided great door prizes, direct donations to Make-A-Wish, and promotional discounts that allowed the club to purchase prizes for a raffle.

The MAA also sold concessions to raise money for Make-A-Wish, which grants the wishes of children diagnosed with life-threatening medical conditions.
