Top qualifier Roy Andrassy suffered a crash coming out of Pylon Three on the first lap after flying through another airplane's turbulence. The saddest moment in my memory involved Danny Kane's DNS (did not start) in his last or next-to-last round while he was leading the event in points. His engine suddenly experienced fuel starvation, and quit on release.

When the debris settled—and there was lots of it—we had a clear winner: Jim Allen. Second place was Trey Witte who fought every heat alongside his

friend and caller, Dean Stone. The third through tenth places followed this order: Rich Beers, Chuck Andraka, Dan Kane, Anthony Hemken, Randy Ritch, Mike Langlois, John McDermott, and Dub Jett.

Randy Ritch earned top points to become Nats Grand Champion, and was quick to give a heartfelt thank you to his caller and close friend of many years, Dennis Cranfill. A special thanks from all of us to Randy Ritch for donating all the fuel used during every Pylon Nats for as long as I can remember.

This concludes my last Nats report. Thanks to all of the contestants and the AMA staff for all the compliments. See you again next year.
